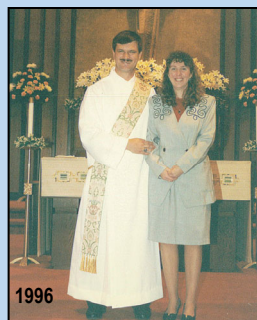

We are happy to announce the 25th Anniversary of Deacon David Lapinski's ordination to the Permanent Diaconate and his many years of service to Our Lady of Victory Parish. A Mass celebrating Deacon Dave will be held on Sunday, April 25th, at 11:30 AM.

Dave joined OLV parish in 1972 while he was attending Penn State and has been faithfully serving the parish ever since. In 1983 he became one of our first Eucharistic Ministers. In 1990 Dave began teaching CCD and began leading the Confirmation Program in 1993. After encouragement from our then pastor, Msgr. Patrick Fleming, Dave entered the Permanent Diaconate Formation Program in 1992. After several years of study Dave was ordained on April 20, 1996 by Bishop Joseph Adamec who assigned him to OLV, his home parish, where he has served the past 25 years as our Deacon with pastors Msgr. Philip Saylor, Fr. Martin McCamley, Msgr. David Lockard and currently Fr. Neil Dadey.

As an ordained minister of the Catholic Church, Deacon Dave is called to functions of Word, Sacrament, and Charity. As minister of the Word he proclaims the Gospel, preaches, and has taught CCD classes, Confirmation preparation, adult religious education and Marriage Preparation classes. As minister of the Sacraments he has celebrated over 979 baptisms, witnessed numerous marriages and conducted many wakes and graveside funeral services. For Charity, Dave has been involved with St. Vincent DePaul and the Knights of Columbus. FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, this Sunday afternoon at 3:00 pm Our Lady of Victory will celebrate the **SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION** for our young adults in our parish. It is my honor to administer the sacrament to our men and women since Bishop Mark has delegated pastors of the various churches to administer the sacrament in his place due to the virus. To encourage them to live up to their baptismal promises is a daunting task; however, I am certain, from reading their letters to me, their task of witnessing to the Risen Lord will occur in their lives. Congratulations young adults as you continue your spiritual journey to the Lord.

Being that there are new regulations at our hospital, limiting visitors even more, I am encouraging parishioners entering the hospital for whatever reason to please **COME TO THE RECTORY FOR ANOINTING OF THE SICK** if you wish to receive the sacrament. The priests are allowed to come for an anointing in **EXTREME CASES**, i.e. in case of death. But we are discouraged to come for "ordinary visitation" until the "all clear sign" is given. So, if you are going in for surgery or any other reason, we would be happy to anoint you before the procedure, ensuring that you have received the sacrament.

As we continue our **JOURNEY THROUGH THE YEAR WITH ST JOSEPH**, I thought I would just continue some information concerning St. Joseph and his history within the church which comes to us from the Diocese. Pope Pius IX names Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. "When Joseph woke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took his wife, but he knew her not until she had borne a son; and he called his name Jesus." (Mt 1:20-25) The earliest traces of public recognition of the sanctity of St. Joseph are to be found in the East. His feast was kept by the Copts as early as the beginning of the fourth century. The feast of "Joseph the Carpenter" is entered, on 20 July, in one of the old Coptic Calendars of the eighth and ninth century. In the West the name of the foster-father of Our Lord (Nutritor Domini) appears in local martyrologies. In 1870 on the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception, Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. Pius IX recognized, along with the world bishops, that they had sought the intercession of St. Joseph often during a time of great persecution and turmoil in the Church in Italy and around the world. "Because of the sublime dignity which God conferred on His most faithful Servant, the Church has always most highly honored and lauded the Most Blessed Joseph next after his spouse, the Virgin Mother of God, and has implored his intercession in all her great necessities." In the same declaration, March 19th was designated as the double feast day of the Solemnity of Joseph, the Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. <https://stjsa.org/pope-pius-ix-and-st-joseph>. 2021, Diocese of Altoona-Johnstown.

Saint John Paul II and the Church's devotion to Saint Joseph

"After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Child why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety. Then he went down with them to Nazareth, and was obedient to them." (Lk 2:46-49)

Saint John Paul II speaks of the Church's devotion to St. Joseph: "This patronage must be invoked as ever necessary for the Church, not only as a defense against all dangers, but also, and indeed primarily, as an impetus for her renewed commitment to evangelization in the world and to re-evangelization in those lands and nations where religion and the Christian life were formerly flourishing and are now put to a hard test."
