FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, As we are coming up on a year dealing with the pandemic and the struggle to keep the church and school open, I want to **THANK** all those who have banded together in following all the guidelines (communion in the hand and masks especially) protecting the safety of all involved. I know it has been difficult on the part of all people, **INCLUDING YOUR PRIESTS.** We have come together and have kept our church and school open throughout this time, except during the time we were required to close last spring. I am hoping that with the rollout of the vaccine, we might be able to turn the corner on this and get back to some sense of normalcy very soon.

I also want to **THANK** all those parishioners who appreciated and still appreciate all the hard work Fr. Jonathan and I have gone through to keep the parish and school safe. We were and are not looking for any praise, but it is nice to know that some have appreciated what has taken place. Your notes of appreciation in the Christmas cards sent and/or your comments after various Masses mean so much to Fr. Jonathan and myself. So often we overlook and take for granted all those who have worked so hard. I just wanted to thank all who have joined Fr. Jonathan and myself in keeping OLV Church and School open. And a special thanks once again to TERRY STEC, our "man in the trenches" for the school and church safety protocols. God bless you Terry for your care and love for OLV.

And to be very honest with you, I know that our insistence in wearing masks and receiving communion in the hand has **RANKLED** a few people. It is something they are not used to do. **SO, I WILL BE VERY FRANK WITH EVERYONE.** Understand that as pastor I have to look out for the whole church, every person that walks into this church to be fed spiritually, **AND DO WHAT IS BEST FOR EVERYONE, NOT JUST 2 OR 3.** If one cannot get into a department store, doctor's office, Walmart, Giant or wherever at this time without a mask to prevent germs from being spread from one to another, why would anyone expect us to place our fingers in the mouth of someone, possibly infecting them or being infected ourselves just because they feel spiritually right. In celebrating the sacraments, we are instructed to not touch anyone in any way. We are not to bless throats in the normal way nor are we to give ashes on the forehead. Yet, there are those who want us to possibly touch their tongue or lips with our fingers when giving communion. Does that make sense? I just do not understand the logic of that thinking. Jesus preached and taught about love for one another and taking care of one another. We have been so good over the past year, I just would hate to see us go downhill now that we have a vaccine and hopefully are turning the corner on this. I thank the 99.9% of those who have followed what we have been trying to accomplish here this year. Keep hanging in there. There is light ahead.

A few weeks ago, over the weekend and into Monday, our **PHONE SYSTEM** went down due to mechanical problems. I am drawing your attention to this because I know that phone calls were coming into the rectory that was not answered. I truly hope that those who called did not think, "Well they are there; why don't they answer." It is not because we don't want to answer. It is because we **CANNOT ANSWER.** We try to get things fixed as soon as possible, but when they happen over the weekend, as sometimes it does, we have to wait until Monday to have them rectified. Thank you for understanding our situation when these things happen and please be patient when they do.
