Academic excellence is the hallmark of Catholic education intentionally directed to the growth of the whole person – mind, body, and spirit. Finally, service is fundamental to Catholic education and the core of Catholic discipleship. Service is intended to help form people who are not only witnesses to Catholic social teaching, but also active participants through social learning. Catholic schools, like the Catholic Church, are not a building or an institution, but it is the people. As the people of God, we work together to bring the Kingdom of God to Earth and raise up the next generation to do the same. This past Monday, **MSGR. PHILIP SAYLOR** passed into eternal life. Msgr. was a good friend of OLV, serving as its pastor for a few years and then helping out as a retired senior priest with Mass celebrations and hearing confessions. He will be fondly remembered as a loving priest to parishioners, always being open to being taken out for breakfast after the morning Masses. His priestly ministry was appreciated by me personally as he helped when the priests were at conferences or out of town. I know he enjoyed OLV parishioners and their visits, especially in his final years at Harmony. This Wednesday we remember **ST. BLAISE**, Bishop, and Martyr. Saint Blaise was the bishop of Sebastea and a doctor. The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throats. Many of the miraculous aspects of St. Blaise's life are written 400 years after his martyrdom in the "Acts of St. Blaise." Saint Blaise is believed to begin as a healer then, eventually, became a "physician of souls." He then retired to a cave, where he remained in prayer. People often turned to Saint Blaise for healing miracles. In 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was choking to death on a fishbone, at his feet. Blaise cured the child, and though Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him. In keeping with tradition, we will bless throats ***in toto*** as the concluding prayer for the Prayers of the Faithful, after the 2 morning Masses 7:00 and 9:00. **INDIVIDUAL BLESSINGS WILL NOT BE GIVEN DUE TO COVID REGULATIONS.**
