The Rosary is prayed at 8:25am, Mon., Tues., Thurs., Fri. & Sat., before the 9:00am Mass. On Wednesday, it is prayed at 8:15am. No Rosary on Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday.

Tenebrae Evening Prayer Service will be held this Wednesday, March 31 at 7:00pm in the Church. The ancient service of Tenebrae "shadows" grew out of a combination of morning and night prayer with an additional focus on the Passion of the Lord. It also involves the gradual extinguishing of several candles, suggesting a time of darkness and gloom in Jesus' absence from our lives. The large candle on the altar (representing the Savior himself) remains lit and then is removed from the altar to symbolize the death of Jesus. After the Lord's Prayer, a time of silence is observed in total darkness. The silence is broken by the strepitus, a loud noise symbolizing the closing of the tomb. At the end of the service, all leave silently.

Important Announcement Concerning OLV COVID Guidelines

We have noticed that weekly Mass attendance has steadily increased over the last few weeks. Whether it is due to people receiving vaccinations, being on our way toward 'herd immunity', the warmer weather or a combination of all three, this is truly wonderful news! It has been nice to see some familiar faces returning to Mass. If this trend continues and it appears that it will, more seating will need to be made available to accommodate the increased attendance. Some adjustments to seating may be made as soon as Palm Sunday depending on attendance.

When the return to in-person Mass began in June of last year, we implemented the following attendance and seating guidelines:

- Mask wearing was required.
Mask wearing will still be required until the mandate is lifted.

- Parishioners were seated utilizing every other pew and parishioners seated in the pews were asked to keep 6 feet of distance between individuals or families. As attendance increases, pews that have been closed to seating will now be utilized as necessary to avoid crowding too many parishioners into one pew. Ushers will assist if needed. (Recent studies suggest that 3 feet of distancing between people while also utilizing masks poses the same transmission risk as 6 feet of distancing.) If necessary, this will allow us to safely utilize all pews and allow people to sit comfortably. We still ask that you maintain a safe distance from the person or family that you may be sharing the pew with you.

FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, since we are entering into the **HOLiest WEEK OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR**, I thought it would be nice to reflect on the **MEANING OF THIS WEEK**. I found this article and thought it would be great to reprint it for it does sum up what this week is all about. *Holy Week is most definitely a very sacred time of the year, for it is now that we will commemorate and remember the last week of Jesus' life on this earth. These are the days leading up to the great Easter Feast. The Lenten season of sacrifice and self-denial is about to come to an end, but this coming week is extremely important for all Christians. The greatest focus of the week is the Passion (suffering) and Resurrection of Jesus Christ and the events that led up to it.*

Historical documents tell us that as early as the fourth century the Church celebrated this "Great Week" with a feeling of profound sanctity. It begins with Palm Sunday, which marks Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The central feature of the service proper to this day, as it was in the earliest times, is the procession of palms. The palms are blessed and are then borne in procession to the church, where an entry is made with a certain amount of ceremony, after which the Mass is celebrated. The other notable and very ancient feature of the present Palm Sunday service is the reading of the Gospel of the Passion by three readers.

Especially important for Catholics is the Easter Triduum. This is the three days just before Easter. On Holy Thursday, we reenact the Lord's Last Supper, which He shared with His apostles on the night He was betrayed and arrested. This is one of the most beautiful liturgies of the entire liturgical year. At the Mass, the priest will wash the feet of twelve men, just as Jesus did. Also, on this night, priests all over the world will renew their sacred vows. This is because, at the Last Supper, Jesus not only instituted the Mass (Eucharist) but also the ministerial priesthood.

On Good Friday, the day of the crucifixion and death of our Lord, we have the veneration of the Cross. A service is held at three o'clock in the afternoon (the hour He is believed to have died) and another later in the evening. We go forward and kiss the Cross in order to show honor and respect for Christ's sacrifice for our sake. There is no consecration of the Eucharist on this day, and the Communion we receive will be from the night before, which has been reserved in the tabernacle.

Holy Saturday is a vigil. We keep watch for the expectant rising of Our Savior. This was the day He went down into the netherworld in order to bring back up with Him into heaven those who had died before His coming. Up to this time, the gates to heaven were closed and no one could go there because of the original sin of Adam. Jesus changed all that. By paying the price for our sins on the Cross, He gained for us our eternal salvation, and heaven was opened once more. Also, on this night, persons who have spent months of preparation will be received through Baptism and Confirmation into the Catholic Church for the first time. It is a joyous occasion.

*Those who engage themselves wholeheartedly in living the entire paschal cycle (Lent, Triduum and Easter's Fifty Days) discover that it can change them forever. This is especially so of the Triduum which, standing at the heart of the Easter season, is an intense immersion in the fundamental mystery of what it is to be Christian. During these days, we suffer with Christ so that we might rise with Him at His glorious Resurrection. Holy Week is a time to clear our schedules of unnecessary activities. Our minds and hearts should be fixed on Jesus and what He did for us. Let us bear the Cross so that may be worthy of wearing the crown He wore. (Reprinted from CERC). **COVID directives apply to the above liturgies.***

Please remember in your prayers **ALL PRIESTS OF THE DIOCESE** who will be going to the Cathedral of the Blessed Sacrament this Monday to renew their priestly ministry with Bishop Mark. It is a very important time for each priest to rededicate themselves to Jesus in service to their parishioners.

As a reminder, our **PENANCE SERVICE** will be this Sunday at 2:00 PM. We will have the assistance of several priests so waiting will not be long.

DUE TO ADORATION ON THURSDAY EVENING (and encouraging many to come then) WE WILL NOT HAVE ADORATION ON WEDNESDAY.

THE RECTORY WILL BE CLOSED FROM WEDNESDAY, 12:00 NOON THROUGH EASTER SUNDAY. WE WILL REOPEN ON MONDAY AT 9:00 AM.
