FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, it is very hard to believe that it was 40 years ago Sunday that Bishop Hogan called my name and I responded "PRESENT" for the beautiful gift of the priesthood. To be honest with you, I never thought that I would have 40 years under my belt serving as God's priest to the people of the Diocese. So much has happened, both personally and within the parishes I have served. It has been a wonderful 40 years. I have served under some of the best pastors and I have served with some of the best assistants and deacons that the Diocese has to offer. As I look back over the years, I have many great memories, experienced so much, and have come to love the parishioners with whom I have worked. But you know the greatest joy of my life, outside of ministering the sacraments to all or dealing with people and their issues, I found great joy in simply working with the people who surrounded me with love, warmth, concern, support, and kindness. Success in ministry is not just limited to one person; it involves many support staff and parishioners working together bringing about God's kingdom upon this earth. When priests and parishioners work together, many great things happen and it did over my 40 years. I am eternally grateful to all who walked with me. At times, it was not all that easy. I guess no vocation is always easy. But it was all worth it. To know that in some small way God used me through the years to further His Kingdom upon the earth by preaching of His love and mercy brought and continues to bring me great peace. I hope that in some way, everyone who heard me preach or saw me in my ministry has come to know Jesus Christ and His great love for them. I will be eternally grateful to Jesus for allowing me to share in His ministry over these 40 years. May God continue to bless all of us as we continue to journey together until the day in eternity we can all rejoice and praise Him in heaven forever. Thanks to all and God bless.

And now, the **REST OF THE STORY**. After 40 years and after praying about it for a year and in consultation with Bishop Mark, I have asked the Bishop to grant me retirement (Senior Priest Status) in June due to health reasons. I will not go into details about the issues I have been battling with over the years. That is a private matter. But I will say that with the heart not acting properly, with spinal issues, and with the effects of present leukemia and past chemo treatments, my body is not what it once was, (as we all can say). My energy level has dropped drastically and I felt it was time to retire before my health went down too much. I know this might come as a shock to most since I do not look sick, but my inner self is not up to par. My last day here at OLV will be the weekend of June 5-6, with my leaving shortly after Masses. Again, I am so very grateful for having spent 13 years of my priesthood here, from beginning to end. Please keep me in your prayers and Father Jakopac who is coming in my place.

ANOTHER CATHOLIC MINISTRY DRIVE UPDATE – as of this typing we have 417 pledges promising a total of \$170,265.00 towards our goal of \$148,316.00. This means that we now have \$21,949.00 returning to the parish for ordinary parish expenses. I am so very grateful to all parishioners who have contributed to this Drive, knowing that all monies collected will go to help those in the Diocese in various ways. And so, every dollar now pledged is returned to the parish which means that any further contribution is a contribution to OLV Parish. God has truly been so good to us.

Saint Joseph, Protector of the Church, pray for us.

According to historical theologian, Fr. Joseph F. Chorpenning, "The name Joseph means 'a son that grows' and in Hebrew this refers to a beautiful tree, because beneath this tree...Mary and Jesus were protected and sheltered."

Joseph is told by an angel in a dream, "Arise, and take the child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and remain there until I tell thee, For Herod will seek the child to destroy him." (Mt 2:13) After returning to his own country, he led a hidden life in the tiny and obscure village of Nazareth of Galilee. [1]

Joseph then nurtured his foster son, Jesus, and protected him during his childhood. Because of Joseph's protection of his foster son and of Mary, we consider him to be the protector of the Catholic Church.

"O God, who in your inexpressible providence were pleased to choose Saint Joseph as spouse of the most holy Mother of your Son, grant, we pray, that we, who revere him as our protector on earth, may be worthy of his heavenly intercessions. Through Christ our Lord, Amen" (Votive Mass of Saint Joseph)
