FROM THE PASTOR.....MY DEAR PARISH FAMILY, Terry Stec wrote this email to the school parents and I felt it was important to reprint it for you allowing you to see the continued progress we are making in and for our school. Since this was written a few weeks ago, the time frame is a little off, but the content is what I want you to read. We are entering the home stretch of the playground project. If you have driven or walked through the backlot recently you may have noticed that a large pile of stone that was generously donated by Steve and Sheryl Balkey in conjunction with Hanson Aggregates was placed in the playground area, thanks to Lindsey Kiefer and Dave Silner. For those of you who aren't familiar with Lindsey Kiefer (I assume that most are not), he is a very gracious community member and a neighbor of a few of our school families. Lindsey has no children or connection to our school, but has volunteered his time, talent, expertise, and equipment and has been a vital part of the playground project. It would have been much more difficult and expensive to undertake this project without him. If you know him or happen to see him outback on a piece of equipment, please give him a big thank you! Now, it is time for the Mulch! One of our parents, Amanda Pruss, is an employee of Scott's Landscaping and has arranged for a lot of mulch to be delivered to the school. Amanda plans on being at the school and with a few of her fellow employees to move the mulch from the lot to the playground. She will be using heavy equipment to move the mulch. Although a good portion of the mulch will be placed with the equipment, there will still be a need for some manual labor using rakes and possibly shovels to move the mulch around. If you have time and are interested in volunteering next Saturday, June 5, shoot me a response to this and I will get you more details on reporting time and what you may need to bring. I am truly grateful to all those parishioners and friends who contributed their time and finances to give the school this wonderful "playground" equipment. Once again, it shows the love and dedication that many have to our school and church. May God bless all who made this project a success.

This Monday our country **CELEBRATES MEMORIAL DAY.** It is the time when we pause and remember all those who have given the ultimate sacrifice for the freedoms that we enjoy within our country, freedoms that in today's day and age are being taken for granted or not appreciated. Memorial Day officially became a federal holiday in 1971, but it had previously been observed in an unofficial capacity for quite some time. A similarly thoughtful, commemorative day reportedly took place back on May 1, 1865, in Charleston, South Carolina. The History Channel reports that after the Civil War ended and Confederate soldiers left Charleston, a group of freed slaves gathered to bury and honor the bodies of Union soldiers via a small parade. And in 1868, Union General John A. Logan suggested that May 30 should be the first annual day dedicated to the memory of all soldiers who fell during the Civil War. But the commemoration of such "memorial days" remained unofficial for several more decades. According to the Library of Congress, it wasn't until 1950 that Congress would agree upon a resolution asking the president to "issue a proclamation calling upon the people of the United States to observe...Memorial Day, by praying, each following his religious faith, for permanent peace." Nearly 20 years later in 1968, the Uniform Monday Holiday Act was finally passed, which both declared that Memorial Day would take place on the last Monday in May and required that federal employees be granted a day off. In 1971, Memorial Day officially became a federal holiday intended to observe and honor the people who lost their lives while serving in the U.S. military. Since this is a national holiday, the rectory office will be closed from Saturday through Monday and will reopen on Tuesday at 9:00 AM. There will be only one Mass celebrated at 9:00 AM on Memorial Day.

- The 5 candles at the feet of the Blessed Mother read as follows from left to right: red 1 for the Pope, red 2 for our Bishop, blue for Fr Ralph and the school in Benin Ghana, red 3 for our pastor and parish clergy, red 4 for our young people in discernment for their futures. The colors of the votive candle holders vary with the liturgical season.
