**Saint Joseph Patris Corde,
5. A Creatively Courageous Father**

If at times God seems not to help us, surely this does not mean that we have been abandoned, but instead are being trusted to plan, be creative, and to find solutions ourselves. Faced with imminent danger from Herod, who wanted to kill the child, Joseph was warned once again in a dream to protect the child, and rose in the middle of the night to prepare the flight into Egypt. (Mt 2:13-14)

The Gospel does not tell us how long Mary, Joseph and the Child Jesus remained in Egypt. Yet they certainly needed to eat, to find a home and employment. It does not take much imagination to fill in those details. The Holy Family had to face concrete problems like every other family, like so many of our migrant brothers and sisters who, risk their lives and their families, to escape misfortune and hunger to seek employment and asylum in a foreign land. In this regard, I consider Saint Joseph the special patron of all those forced to also leave their native lands because of war, hatred, persecution and poverty.

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time (October 10)

"The eye of a needle," in today's gospel, was a tight passageway into Jerusalem. Travelers with camels passing through had to remove whatever the camel was carrying that was the barrier for entrance. If we look at our own lives, we can probably think of something we carry that holds us back. Maybe it is possessions, material goods or money. Or maybe it is status, pride or control. What will happen when we reach the gate of heaven and we won't fit into the narrow gate?

Jesus doesn't want our "stuff." He knows our struggles and gives us many opportunities to choose Him, to overcome our attachments, and surrender. It could be a tragic event, a rough week, an unexpected expense that depletes our saving, or the loss of material goods. These moments are opportunities that Jesus allows in our lives to grow in holiness and we should not waste those moments. Pray for the grace to overcome them, don't pass by these opportunities and work on creating moments to detach yourself from your "stuff."
