Day 1 - Sunday, May 3 (D)

State College → Lake George, NY

- Visit the National Shrine of the North American Martyrs (Auriesville, NY), birthplace
 of Kateri Tekakwitha. This site commemorates the Jesuit missionaries martyred in the
 1640s and honors their sacrifice and early North American Catholic heritage.
- Celebrate a private Mass and enjoy time for prayer and reflection as you walk the serene grounds.
- Overnight at Hampton Inn Lake George, followed by a cozy, rustic dinner at Log Jam, offering Adirondack-style comfort food—perfect for beginning this pilgrimage in a spirit of warmth and fellowship.

Day 2 – Monday, May 4 (B, D)

Lake George → **Montreal, Quebec**

- Breakfast at the hotel.
- Cross into Canada and arrive in Montreal; your local guide will meet you upon arrival.
- Lunch on your own in charming **Old Montreal**, among cafés and bistros reflecting the city's French-inspired heritage.
- Guided sightseeing across the city: scenic strolls among historic districts, a panoramic view from Mount Royal Park, and visits to iconic sites like markets and city highlights.
- Check in at **Best Western Plus Downtown Montreal**, located in the heart of the lively **Quartier des Spectacles**, close to Old Montreal, Chinatown, and the Latin Quarter.
- Evening highlight: the extraordinary Aura Experience at Notre-Dame Basilica
 (Montreal), where light, music, and architecture combine to bring the basilica's sacred space to life in a spectacular, immersive presentation.



Day 3 - Tuesday, May 5 (B, D)

Montreal Touring Day

- Breakfast included
- Begin with a visit to Saint Joseph's Oratory of Mount Royal, Canada's largest church, an architectural marvel with its soaring dome and serene ambiance. A guided tour and English-language Mass offer both spiritual depth and cultural appreciation.
- After lunch on your own, tour the Gothic-Revival splendor of Notre-Dame
 Basilica—admiring its ornate stained-glass windows, vaulted ceiling, and rich history.
- In the afternoon, enjoy a scenic river cruise with Croisières AML along the St. Lawrence River aboard the AML Cavalier Maxim — a peaceful way to take in Montreal's skyline and landmarks from the water.
- Dinner is included at a local restaurant, rounding out this full day of spiritual, historic, and scenic experiences.

Day 4 – Wednesday, May 6 (B, D)

Montreal → Quebec City

- Breakfast included
- Arrive in historic Québec City, where timeless European charm meets North American legacy.
- Lunch on your own within the fortified walls of **Old Quebec**, amidst medieval-style streets, centuries-old architecture, and lively street life.
- Afternoon sightseeing includes a tour of historic sites: Parliament Hill, Battlefield Park
 (site of the Plains of Abraham), the cobblestone beauty of Place d'Armes, a visit to the
 majestic Château Frontenac, and a ride down the hillside via funicular for panoramic
 city views.
- Conclude with a visit to **Notre-Dame de Québec Basilica-Cathedral**, one of North America's oldest Catholic basilicas (dating originally to 1647), where you'll enjoy a Mass and guided tour.
- Overnight at Best Western Plus City Center Québec City, followed by a dinner at a local restaurant.



Day 5 - Thursday, May 7 (B, D)

St. Anne & Scenic Wonders

- Visit the majestic Basilica of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, a revered national shrine of Canada, known for its beautiful architecture and the many recorded miracles experienced by pilgrims, for a tour and Mass.
- Nearby, a variety of charming brasseries and cafés offer the perfect spot for lunch on your own. Your guide will be on hand to assist with recommendations and directions, ensuring a smooth and enjoyable visit.
- Afternoon brings natural wonder: explore Montmorency Falls—walk across a suspension bridge high above the roaring falls, then descend by gondola for an upclose view of the cascade.
- Finally, delve into traditional craft at the **Albert Gilles Copper Museum**, with guided tours, artisan demonstrations, and the opportunity to create your own copper keepsake.
- Dinner included at a local restaurant to end your day of reflection, beauty, and heritage.

Day 6 – Friday, May 8 (B, L, D)

Quebec City → Kahnawake → Lake George

- · Breakfast included
- Visit the St. Kateri Tekakwitha Shrine in Kahnawake a place of deep spiritual significance, where pilgrims may reflect, pray at her tomb, and learn about the blending of Indigenous and Catholic heritage in North America.
- Enjoy lunch at Kahnawake Brewery, where local flavor meets heritage in a warm, welcoming atmosphere.
- Return to Lake George for the night, with dinner at a local restaurant and time for rest before your final day of pilgrimage.



Day 7 - Saturday, May 9 (B, L)

Lake George → **Fonda, NY** → **Home**

- Breakfast included
- Conclude your pilgrimage with a visit to the **Saint Kateri Tekakwitha National Shrine & Historic Site** in Fonda, NY home to Saint Peter's Chapel, a museum of Indigenous artifacts, the Caughnawaga archaeological village, the holy spring of Kateri's baptism, and peaceful woodland trails.
- Reflect and soak in the holiness of this historic shrine before enjoying a final meal at a local restaurant and departing for home — carrying memories, faith, and renewed spiritual inspiration.
